## **Community and Economic Development**

## 2021 Project Review

As part of the grants administration services, the District assists local governments with securing funding from multiple federal and state agencies. Some of these include:

## **Arkansas Economic Development Commission (AEDC)**

#### September 2021

The Arkansas Economic Development Commission (AEDC) awarded the City of Lincoln \$307,285.00 and the City of Yellville \$227,590.00 through its general assistance set-aside program to rehabilitate the existing wastewater systems which includes replacement of manholes and sewer lines. Through the efforts of Catherine Baker, Community Deveoopment administrator, the City of Leslie completed its sidewalk/drainage project, and Carroll County completed renovations at the Carroll County Health Unit.

#### October 2021

The Arkansas Economic Development Comission (AEDC) awarded Marion County a \$200,000 Economic Development Grant. This investment benefited Vexus Boats in Flippin, AR by allowing them to expand operations which was expected to create 50 new full-time positions.

#### March & August 2021

NWAEDD remained active with AEDC's Rural Services Division by totaling \$189,183.50 in grant awards. Grantees included the communities of Baxter County (Galatia Community Center), Boone County (Bergman VFD), Gravette, Marshall, Pindall (PG&S VFD), Washington County (Round Mountain VFD), and Winslow. These grants helped renovate community centers, purchase firefighting equipment, and city equipment.

## **FEMA Hazard Mitigation Planning**

Community and Economic Development Coordinator, Tina Cole, stayed very busy last year leading efforts to help counties throughout Northwest Arkansas update their FEMA Hazard Mitigation plans. She attended numerous quorum court and city council meetings to educate communities and help them understand the importance of adoption of Hazard Mitigation plans. Boone County and Marion County were both completed and approved by FEMA in 2021.



## Community and Economic Development

The Community and Economic Development Division is pleased to report that 2021 was full of successful achievements. NWAEDD was responsible for writing and administering approximately \$2,649,291.60 million in new grant awards throughout the nine-county region. Significant progress was made despite the circumstances of the time. In the world of community & economic development, the outcomes seen in one year are often a direct result of the previous years' work, and there is no doubt that 2020 provided extensive challenges in the development and planning of community projects. However difficult the challenges may have been, it did bring awareness to the strengths and weaknesses that exist throughout the region.

In 2021 the Community & Economic Development staff was proactive in engaging member governments to assist with determining eligibility of projects under provisions of the various funding programs, ensuring compliance with program requirements, and answering questions & making referrals to other programs.



NWAEDD continued its strong partnership with the Economic Development Administration (EDA). Construction is underway at the Harrison Goblin Drive project and at Berryville to make infrastructure improvements to its new industrial park. Another highlight from last year was the Southwest Region Economic Development Association (SWREDA) 2021 Annual Conference which NWAEDD had the opportunity to host in Rogers. Strong economic development projects that are funded by the U.S. EDA Austin Regional office are recognized each year. The Northwest Arkansas Robotics Training Center was chosen as one of the "Star of the Southwest Awards." Steve Clark, President/CEO of the Fayetteville Chamber of Commerce, and Joe Willis, Executive Director, proudly shared the story behind the project.

## **Community & Economic Development**

We have seen a significant focus on outdoor recreation over the past few years. This led to a very productive year working with our members to secure FUN Park & Matching Grants to develop and improve community park facilities.

In 2021 several communities reached out to the District for assistance with grant writing and administration services to apply for funding from the Arkansas Department of Transportation to help with construction of new trail systems and trail repairs at community parks.

Last but certainly not least, we must mention the impact from the Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Fund which allocated a total of approximately **\$219.5 million dollars** to the counties, metro cities, and non-entitlement units in the NWAEDD region to support their response and recovery from the COVID-19 public health emergency under the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021.

The District is collaborating with the communities of Cotter, Garfield, Gassville, Flippin, Madison County, Oak Grove, Searcy County, St. Paul, and Valley Springs with administration of the funds. Since the passing of this legislation, the community and economic development staff has gone through extensive and ongoing training to be a guiding resource for members. We held the first ever County Judges Forum to provide information and gather a better understanding of how to support local governments through the process.



# NORTHWEST WORKFORCE INNOVATION AND OPPORTUNITY ACT SUCCESS STORIES 2021

#### Verginia Abo, WIOA Adult Nursing Program



Verginia Abo is one of the first two Marshallese students to enroll in the Northwest Technical Institute (NWTI) licensed practical nursing (LPN) program. Her mother died of COVID in June 2020 at the age of 54 and was part of her inspiration for enrolling in the program. Verginia moved to Springdale with her family from the Marshall Islands in 1997. She graduated from Springdale High School in 2005. She has observed a need for medical care within the Marshallese community. "People around me had a lot of diabetes and heart failure," she said.

Verginia was enrolled in the CNA program at Petro through the WIOA Adult program. Verginia graduated in October 2020 and started the LPN program in January 2021.

#### Charm Keef, National Dislocated Worker Grant (NDWG) Participant

Charm Keef had been laid off due to the COVID crisis in 2020. She came to NWAEDD with limited work skills which became a barrier to her finding new employment. Charm was placed in a full-time work experience at the City of Jasper under the NDWG program. Charm's job duties included supervising other NDWG participants at her worksite and being responsible for making sure all the FEMA paperwork was completed timely and accurately. Her supervisor at the City of Jasper complimented her, saying that she was a great employee, was friendly and always showed up on time. Thanks to the experience Charm gained through the NDWG program she was able to get a full-time job in customer service with Windstream. Her position with Windstream provides an increase in her income with additional employee benefits. Charm is thankful to NWAEDD's WIOA program and the City of Jasper for the opportunity to improve her skills and for their help with finding a full-time job.

#### **Disaster/National Dislocated Worker Grant (NDWG)**

He was able to learn many things working for the road department while in the NDWG program. He shared that being in this program has played a huge role in his success in acquiring his new full-time job outside of the program. The City of Jasper reports it is pleased to have Harold as the Park Supervisor and knows he will do a good job.






## North Arkansas Transportation Services

North Arkansas Transportation Service (NATS) has built a sound reputation throughout its 40-year history. If you live in Baxter, Boone, Marion, Newton, Searcy, parts of Carroll, Fulton, Izard, and Madison Counties, you have probably seen the NATS vehicles driving around in your community. Some of the public transportation services provided by NATS include

- Commuter Service Routes for workers who live in rural areas
- City Routes restarted in 2022 for Harrison and Mountain Home
- Demand Response services Monday-Friday that can take passengers shopping, to medical appointments, errands, etc.

2021 was an eventful year for NATS with several updates made to improve efficiency and performance. Through funds received from the CARES Act, NATS purchased four large vans. four fully accessible minivans, and two Dodge trucks. Through a sealed bid process, NATS sold seven well used vans and the trollevs which made room for the 10 new vehicles received last spring. With the additional space, the trolley barn was converted into a second full service garage with two additional bays. The trucks were a significant improvement to the fleet of vehicles and allow drivers to access more rural areas while preventing unnecessary damage to the vans which can occur on the rough terrain of Arkansas dirt roads.

Some other notable successes for NATS included several partnerships with community organizations, including The Learning Center of North Arkansas for its Berryville and Harrison locations as well as Boone County Special Services to provide transportation for its clients and students. Through a partnership with Southeastrans, NATS provides public transportation for Medicaid clients.





The NATS division continues to follow COVID-19 CDC guidelines as well as state and federal directives for the safety of passengers and staff, but it was able to return to some of the less restrictive procedures such as the capacity to transport more than one rider at a time.

NATS also welcomed several new staff members throughout the year to meet increased demand. In the early years, NATS only had five employees, and today there are 43 full and part-time employees.
